Dear Mr. Rosenbaum:

On April 1, 2013, shares in health-care companies surged by more than \$660 million on a tip from the political intelligence firm Height Analytics LLC. According to press reports, as a result of providing market-moving political intelligence information to Height Analytics LLC, Greenberg Traurig has lost Humana Inc. as a client, its relationship with Height Analytics LLC has been terminated, and a preliminary investigation by the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) is now underway. In light of those recent events, I request full disclosure of your lobbying organization's relationships with political intelligence firms.


As an original author of the Stop Trading on Congressional Knowledge (STOCK) Act, I have called for the public oversight of the political intelligence industry since 2006. In its original form, this legislation required the political intelligence industry - those who gather information from government sources on behalf of a client analyzing financial investment decisions - to register under the Lobbying Disclosure Act, just like any lobbying organization. While the STOCK Act, as enacted into law, successfully outlawed insider trading by Members of Congress and their staff, the political intelligence provisions were ultimately stripped from the final bill by the House Majority without consultation or opportunity to offer amendments.

It is my strong belief that Congress and the public deserve to know who is conducting political intelligence activities, what those activities are, and the extent to which lobbying firms such as yours participate. I will be leading the effort in Congress to better understand this lucrative industry and ensure it operates with transparency and fairness. To that end, I respectfully request you provide the following:

- Name of each past and existing political intelligence client or partnership;
- Duration of each past and existing relationship;
- Amount and method of compensation from each political intelligence client; and
- Method of distributing governmental information to political intelligence clients.

Two hundred and eighty-six Members of the House and 60 Senators are on record in support of proper oversight of political intelligence activities. On behalf of those Members of Congress and the American public, I await your prompt reply.
